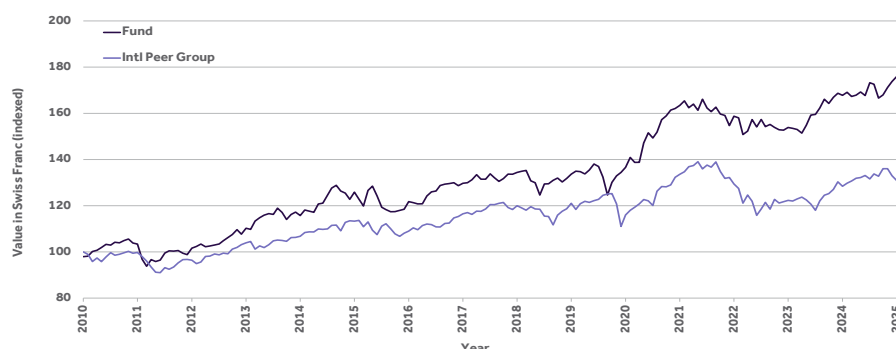

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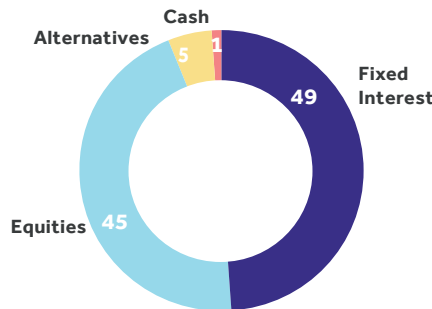
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## Canaccord Genuity Dynamic Fund - CHF suggested asset allocation (%)



## Canaccord Genuity Dynamic Fund - CHF Manager's commentary

### Performance Overview

The Canaccord Genuity Dynamic Fund (CHF I Class) gained +2.31% in September compared with the Morningstar CHF Moderate Allocation peer group's +0.95%. Year-to-date, the fund is up +6.87%, compared with the benchmark return of +3.53%. We continue to enjoy good inflows into the fund, with AUM (Assets under management) now more than GBP 170 million.

### Asset Allocation

- **Equities (45%)** – Exposure held near 45% across a focused 40-stock portfolio. New positions: Novo Nordisk, Oracle, RELX. Exited: Siemens, B&M, Bellway Homes, Roche. Equities added 190 basis points (bp) to returns, led by IT, materials, and financials, while healthcare lagged.
- **Fixed Income (49%)** – Preference for 3 and 6-month UK Treasury Bills over longer-dated gilts ahead of the Autumn Statement. Portfolio duration less than 3 years, yield 4.33%, with some inflation protection and A+/A credit quality. Bonds added 23 bp.
- **Gold (5%)** – The gold rally added 57 bp, with Barrick Mining contributing a further 28 bp.
- **Cash (1%)** – Fully invested, using UK Treasury Bills for liquidity.

### Fixed Interest

The US Federal Reserve (Fed) cut the Federal Funds Rate (FFR) by 0.25% to 4.00–4.25%, citing softer labour data and moderating inflation. Two further cuts are expected this year, with projections for the FFR to fall less than 3.00% by the end of 2026. The Fed remains focused on labour trends, though the government shutdown—halting key data releases—complicates policy decisions. Inflation pressures persist from tariffs and wages. The US yield curve steepened, with the 2-year at 3.61% and the 30-year at 4.73%, reflecting doubts over fiscal discipline and long-term inflation control.

In the UK, the Bank of England (BoE) kept rates at 4.0%, constrained by 3.8% inflation. Though inclined to ease, economic data prevents immediate cuts. Inflation may edge up again in October before easing by year-end. The larger risk is fiscal credibility—high taxes and rising welfare costs threaten growth. The upcoming Autumn Budget will be critical as gilt markets show little tolerance for fiscal slippage.

### Equities

Global equities reached new highs, up +3.46% (GBP terms). Unlike the late-1990s tech bubble, this rally is backed by strong earnings growth: US S&P500 forward earnings hit US\$294.91, with performance broadening beyond megacaps.

Valuations remain elevated at 23x forward price/earnings (P/E), close to 1999 levels, but earnings momentum and expectations of lower rates continue to support risk assets. With liquidity ample and no sign of tightening, there is no near-term catalyst for reversal. Equity exposure remains moderate at 45%, below prior peaks of over 60%. The critical success factor in this market has been to avoid the losers as much as to hold the winners.

### Currencies

Currency markets were calm. The US rate cut and the BoE hold were anticipated. The euro strengthened modestly versus sterling and the US dollar, despite political uncertainty in France, where the Prime Minister's resignation led to the formation of a minority government and the threat of fresh elections.

### Commodities

Gold surged to a record US\$3,859/oz, up +47% YTD (USD), as investors and central banks increased holdings of non-paper assets amid worsening fiscal positions—US interest payments now exceed defence spending. Persistent inflation and fiscal erosion continue to boost demand for gold, commodities, and real assets. Meanwhile, Bitcoin edges closer to institutional acceptance as a form of "digital gold."

Oil eased 1.29% to US\$66.03 (Brent), reducing global inflation pressure. Softer energy prices and Chinese disinflation could support further moderation in global CPI (Consumer Price Index) through 2026, bolstering the case for rate cuts even without a slowdown.

### Summary

- September saw broad equity market gains supported by resilient earnings and expectations of lower interest rates.
- Inflation remains a challenge but is offset by improving fiscal awareness and cooling commodity prices. The BoE held at 4.0%, constrained by sticky inflation and fiscal fragility.
- Gold hit record highs on inflation and fiscal worries, while oil softened, easing inflationary pressures.
- The fund remains well balanced, with equity exposure steady at 45% and short-duration bonds providing income stability while guarding against further volatility at the longer end of the yield curve.
