Important notes

- Method of assessment: 10,000–11,000 word dissertation on a subject relevant to the London Market.

1. Formulate a research question or problem in an area of interest that would be relevant to the London Insurance Market

- 1.1 Formulate a research question or problem that addresses a relevant London Insurance Market insurance or reinsurance issue that is strategic and non routine.

2. Apply appropriate research methodology

- 2.1 Identify potential sources of primary and secondary information required for the dissertation, for example trade publications, journals and interviews.
- 2.2 Compile and maintain a reference list.
- 2.3 Acquire information for the dissertation from a range of relevant and credible sources.

3. Draft a research proposal

- 3.1 Explain the choice of topic and how this is relevant to insurance or reinsurance.
- 3.2 Identify the main concepts or key words in the research question or problem.
- 3.3 Test those main concepts or key words by consulting the appropriate sources or by using the words as search terms.
- 3.4 Narrow the topic if too much information is found and broaden the topic if too little information is found.
- 3.5 Check that the research question or problem is clear, relevant and within ethical guidelines.
- 3.6 Outline the sections to be included in the dissertation document.
- 3.7 Identify the anticipated challenges in completing the dissertation process.
- 3.8 Indicate key milestones, including a timeline.

4. Conduct research for the dissertation

- 4.1 Research the material for the dissertation using a range of relevant and credible sources.
- 4.2 Analyse and apply the information within the context of the research question or problem.

5. Write the dissertation

- 5.1 Draft the dissertation using a range of relevant and credible sources.
- 5.2 Check that the factual foundation of the dissertation is accurate.
- 5.3 Make relevant deductions, conclusions, and recommendations.
- 5.4 Reference the sources used in the dissertation.
- 5.5 Structure the dissertation effectively.
