5	Theme Lead Reports – Theme Leads		
	Succeed in Ashfield – Martin Rigley		
	Martin attended an apprentice session at Sutton Academy last month which was very well attended by students and businesses.		
	Attended the 2020 Pie and a Pint in Sutton in Ashfield, a networking event for employers and good attendance of around 35 businesses. Martin commented that he made some good contacts for his own business and potential users / supporters of ADMC.		

	•	Had a meeting with Mark Dale and Edward Johnstone at Portland Training College to discuss supporting each other's projects.
	•	Attended the UKSPF Subgroup meeting to run through the projects.
	•	Had a visit to ROMO Fabrics with Pete Edwards. The architecture of the building and technology used is incredible. Martin developing links regarding them becoming a Discover Ashfield Ambassador and being involved with the ADMC project.
	•	Attended a Skills Round Table to discuss recruiting people for STEM based careers. Present was the Skills Minister, and a number of Nottinghamshire employers.
	•	Attended a business meeting with Mentor City in Ohio, and educators to potentially start a 'twinning' with businesses in Nottinghamshire.

	•	ATTFE are focusing on positive LWYL comments. Liz commented that Kirkby Leisure Centre is being actively promoted on social media - it is a great thing for the young people of Ashfield to be proud of.
	•	Ashfield Day is coming up and aiming to have this positively endorsed within the LWYL theme.
	•	Liz has been pulling together thoughts for a primary school children network for Autumn, if anyone has any ideas, please contact Liz. They are looking for free resources to support schools and their curriculum.
	•	Work is also underway for the Remembrance and Christmas events within the LWYL scope.
	•	Paula Longden commented that the NHS would like to link in with Ashfield Day.
С	More	to Discover – Darron Ellis
	•	Darron, Trevor and Hollie went to Teversal Visitors Centre to visit Debbie, who has recently started as the centre manager. She has made a noticeable difference in developing the offer and in giving the centre a freshen up. Debbie very keen to hold community and heritage themed events embracing the local community
	•	Work ongoing to bring together Heritage Centres/ Groups so their events and activities do not clash or repeat.
	•	Working on a request from the Events Officer at ADC regarding ideas for commemoration events,
	•	The More to Discover Group is also looking at what information can be used on the new Discover Ashfield website.
	•	The Mills Water Café TV is now operational and will be used for promoting local events.
	•	Darron has had great interest in the Observatory project and Portland Square refurbishment. All very positive comments from visitors from far and wide who have called into the shop in the Idlewells centre.
	•	Teresa Jackson commented that the inequalities programme that looks at health issues on Coxmoor, Butlers Hill and Broomhill is progressing well.

	•	The Partnership Group met in July with two workshops, COVID kids and Ageing Well and Long-Term Conditions. General feedback was that there are
		still challenges post pandemic.

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	•	Pete has begun an access audit of the New Kirkby Leisure Centre and overall its good, with some points raised and will complete the audit once work is complete
	•	Pete has now stepped down for Cavell Stakeholder Reference Group
6	Disco	over Ashfield Project Officer Update
	•	Ashfield Day plans are going well.
	•	The Photography Competition has now closed, the submissions will be collated and sent to the Delivery Group prior to the judging panel. There were 140 photograph entries.
	•	The Awards nominations are also closed, thank you to everyone who nominated candidates
7	Progr	ramme Budget / Inflation Risk Review (Verbal Update) - Paul Crawford
	•	No details of the updated programme and any critical decisions are ready to be made as there are currently three projects progressing through the assurance process.
	•	North Kirkby Gateway, West Kirkby Gateway and Portland Street Sustainable Housing Projects will all have an impact on the programme finances. Once the financial modelling is finalised the outcomes will be reported back to the Board.
	•	These three project business cases are being finalised this month and will be presented to the Board once complete and have been through the assurance process with the subgroup.
	•	Martin Rigley made comment that within his business he has noticed the rate of acceleration of inflation has steadied slightly.
8	Plane	etarium Business Case Update – Steve Wallace
	•	Steve presented on the Science Discovery Centre and Planetarium – attached.
	•	Steve noted that the Business Case has been updated from the one circulated previously, as there has been work on the Levelling Up Bid Round 2 submission, and some assessment guidance has changed, so these have been addressed.
	•	Teresa Jackson asked if there would be more open days. Steve confirms there is one a month and there is a link on their website to book.
	•	Paula Longden asked if due diligence had been done with regards to the financing of the project.
	•	Steve confirms this had been undertaken by Pete Hudson at ADC.
	•	Paul Crawford explained that the assurance process is that Steve Wallace developed the business case, with support from external consultants, and then this case came to the Council. The Council appointed a third-party consultant for the assurance process who reviewed and scrutinised this. The case had already been taken to Pete Hudson and our legal team to ensure they were comfortable with the proposal. It was noted to the Board that all projects are phased and there are steps to take to deliver a project. The next phase is to scrutinise the design and costs.
	•	It was raised by David Ainsworth that upon the implementation phase of the Observatory, that it would be beneficial to think wider than the Observatory as there are opportunities for Science and Technology roles within the future. The NHS has lots of roles in Engineering and Scientific roles. If the NHS could tie in a piece of work to be based at the Observatory and then get some hands-on work in a hospital setting, David would be in support of that.

Steve agreed and explained that in the development phase there were students from Nottingham Trent University and University of Nottingham and currently have students from West Notts. College working on this at the moment. There has also been work with the specialist planetarium provider to provide wider STEM content, such as a beating heart on the planetarium screen. Martin commented that when Lee Anderson MP visited the Observatory, it was discussed that there are developing opportunities for young people in Ashfield. Christine Sarris raised the importance of the links being made with local communities and travel networks, such as tram and bus networks and how these can be linked with other visitor strategies. Decision to take the project forward for submission. Flona Anderson voted to put this forward, Teresa Jackson seconded this decision. Project agreed for submission by the Board. Martin Rigley requested approval from the Board on him signing off the submission, as he is also the Chair of the project board. All agreed for Martin to sign off the submission. Board Member Updates – ALL Simon Martin raised that he chaired the Funding Subgroup, which reviewed the UKSPF projects and all were approved to go through with another meeting to look at the business cases for the Towns Fund projects for the planetarium and the construction centre. Pete Edwards made the Board aware that the Integrated Children and Disability Service at NCC are running an event called Preparing for Adulthood on November 19th in Mansfield. This will be aimed at young disabled people and may be of interest to other Board members. This information will be shared with the Board. David Ainsworth commented that the Board is continuously doing great work and understands that communication is key. David offered the Board members use of high footfall areas within Kings Mill Hospital, Ashfield Health Village Community Hub for leaflets, banners, or advertising, David also explained they have a social meeting and 3D printing. The informatio			
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	stakeholders and partner organisations in the development of the bid. We will look to arrange future stakeholder sessions to carry on the conversation of how we can all work together to promote and develop Hucknall.
