

Fly tipping

What you need to know



What is fly tipping?

It is the illegal dumping of waste or rubbish in places where it is not allowed, instead of using the right ways to get rid of it, such as taking it to your local waste and recycling centre, or arranging collection of larger items from the council.

Dumping waste or rubbish in public areas or on roadsides can be bad for the environment, animals, and can make the area dirty.

Fly tipping is illegal and could lead to penalty notices and fines.





What to do with household waste

Most household waste can go in the bins provided by your local council.

Go to your local council's website to check:

- What kind of household waste your council will collect
- How to order a new bin, if you need one
- Your bin collection day





Bulky waste

Do you have a fridge, sofa or other large item that needs to be collected?

Many local councils provide a bulky waste collection service. Please contact your local council for details on how to arrange this.



Garden waste

Most councils operate a garden waste collection, often in separate bins. Otherwise, take garden waste to your local tip for composting or compost at home.



Did you know?

The council may not collect your bin if you put the wrong items in it. If your bin is 'contaminated' it means they cannot take it to the right processing centre. It is important to check with them what they will and will not take.

Reduce your waste

Before you throw it away, could your items be reused, repaired, or donated?

Many charities will collect good quality second hand goods to reuse.

Other online organisations could also find new homes for your unwanted items.
