
2.2. Scott Base Redevelopment

Costings for the current redevelopment will be further developed as progress is made through design stages. Antarctica NZ has been advised the revised business case must include detailed design, a quantitative risk analysis and costing to a probability of 85% in accordance with Treasury requirements.

To date, we consider s9(2)(f)(iv) to have exhibited strong leadership alongside improved transparency, reporting and planning.

- **Improving public infrastructure asset management** – consideration of adaptation requirements is essential for improved asset management, as evidenced by our research insights paper *Preparing infrastructure providers for natural hazard events: What role for insurance?* (TW-2024-514 refers). Robust infrastructure investment includes maintaining existing assets informed by adaptation planning and avoiding investments that may be rendered redundant by the impacts of climate change.

2.4. Joint proclamation on critical infrastructure protection [DPMC item]

In July this year, New Zealand joined Critical 5 nations in publishing the shared narrative, [*'Adapting to Evolving Threats: A Summary of Critical 5 Approaches to Critical Infrastructure Security and Resilience'*](#).

The Critical 5 (C5) is an international forum made up of members from the Five Eyes alliance – Canada, Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

That shared narrative outlined the evolving risks facing critical infrastructure and discussed how C5 nations have been modernising their approaches to critical infrastructure protection, as well as recognising the need for collaboration among the internal community given the interconnected nature of critical infrastructure.

Since then, C5 nations have been collaborating on a joint proclamation outlining key areas for collaboration between Government and industry including on:

- Identifying interdependencies across critical infrastructure sectors
- Assessing current and emerging risks across all threats and hazards for critical infrastructure
- Incident response and recovery planning
- Proactive collaboration to enable whole-of-community efforts in enhancing critical infrastructure security and resilience.

We are still awaiting both final wording and timing on publishing the joint proclamation from our counterparts at the Departments of Homeland Security in the U.S. and will update you once we have further information. Given differences in Christmas government shutdown periods between the Northern and Southern hemispheres, publication may well happen close to or during Christmas break.

The shared narrative publication did not attract media interest in July; we do not anticipate media interest for this publication.

We will update you on final timing for publication and a copy of the final publication when we receive these from partners.
