Setting you and your project up for success

Sound project oversight is critical for success. Nearly every review into an infrastructure project challenge, points to some kind of 'failure of governance'. Yet those we expect to undertake this crucial responsibility often receive little support or assistance to understand 'what good looks like'.

This workshop is a programme sponsored by Te Waihanga for senior leaders across the infrastructure Public Sector to come together and consider 'what good looks like' in their context.

Topics covered:

The workshop will present good practice concepts followed by a facilitated discussion. Topics will include:

- **Governance and oversight vs management** – establishing an effective authorising environment
- Exploring how the public sector can be a better client of infrastructure
- **Getting the investment thinking 'right' at the start** – making the Business Case a thinking process that sets you up for sound decision-making and project success
- **Assurance** – how this should add significant value (but often doesn't!)
- Effective monitoring and oversight for progress and performance.

Who should attend?

Public Sector senior leaders and executives who have responsibility for the governance and oversight of large infrastructure projects.

Karen Tregaskis, a public sector governance expert, will lead the session. There will also be a guest speaker who has significant experience (and scar tissue!) as an SRO/Sponsor of large infrastructure investments.
